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New York City Rolls Out Coronavirus-Related Small Business Financial Assistance Programs

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New York City has announced its first initiatives to assist small businesses impacted by the Coronavirus. Both programs are aimed at supporting businesses who have experienced a reduction in revenue. The applications for both programs will require businesses to provide documentation such as: point-of-sales reports, bank statements, quarterly sales tax filings, 2019 tax returns, or CPA-certified profit & loss statements.

Employee Retention Program

The first program is targeted at companies (including non-profits) with fewer than five employees and is intended to enable those companies to retain their employees ("**Employee Retention Program**"). New York City is offering to a grant to cover 40% of payroll costs for two months. The criteria for the Employee Retention Program are as follows:

- Be located within the five boroughs of New York City;
- Demonstrate that the COVID-19 outbreak caused at least a 25% decrease in revenue;
- Employ 1-4 employees in total across all locations;
- Have been in operation for at least 6 months; and
- Have no outstanding tax liens or legal judgements

Business Continuity Program

The second program is aimed at companies with 99 employees or less and is offering an interest-free loan for up to \$75,000 to help mitigate losses in profit (**"Business Continuity Program**"). The criteria for the Business Continuity Program are as follows:

- Be located within the five boroughs of New York City
- Demonstrate that the COVID-19 outbreak caused at least a 25% decrease in revenue
- Employ 99 employees or fewer in total across all locations
- Demonstrate ability to repay the loan
- Have no outstanding tax liens or legal judgements
